# ABOUT BOOTSTRAP

- Bootstrap is the HTML, CSS, and JS framework for developing responsive, mobile first projects on the web.
- Bootstrap is the most-starred project on [GitHub](#), with over 93K stars and more than 40K forks.
- Bootstrap ships with vanilla CSS, but its source code utilizes the two most popular CSS preprocessors, [Less](#) and [Sass](#).
- Aims to ease the development of [dynamic websites](#) and [web applications](#).

# HISTORY OF BOOTSTRAP

- Developed by Mark Otto and Jacob Thornton at [Twitter](#) as a framework to encourage consistency across internal tools (originally **Twitter Blueprint**).
- It was renamed to Bootstrap, and released as an open source project on August 19, 2011.
- The Bootstrap 3 release was announced on 19 August, 2013, moving to a [mobile first](#) approach and using a [flat design](#).
- On October 29, 2014 was announced that Bootstrap 4 in development. The first alpha version of Bootstrap 4 was deployed on August 19, 2015.

# FEATURES

- Bootstrap is compatible with the latest versions of the [Google Chrome](#), [Firefox](#), [Internet Explorer](#), [Opera](#), and [Safari](#) browsers.
- Since version 2.0 it also supports [responsive web design](#).
- Starting with version 3.0, Bootstrap adopted a [mobile-first design](#) philosophy, emphasizing responsive design.
- The version 4.0 alpha release added [Sass](#) and [Flexbox](#) support.

# PROJECT ORGANIZATION

- The issue tracker is the preferred channel for bug reports, features requests and submitting pull requests
- Bug tracker utilizes several labels to help organize and identify issues
  - browser bug, css, docs, feature, help wanted, ...
- [@twbs-rorschach](#) is a Bootstrap bot that hangs out in our GitHub issue tracker and automatically checks all pull requests for a few simple common mistakes.
- [@twbs-savage](#) is a Bootstrap bot that automatically runs cross-browser tests (via [Sauce](#) and Travis CI) on JavaScript pull requests.
